



How to use a Digital Wallet: A Comprehensive Tutorial

Introduction to Digital Wallets

Popular Digital Wallet Platforms: Google Wallet & Apple Pay

While many banks and companies offer their own digital wallet solutions, Google Wallet and Apple Pay are two of the most widely used and recognized platforms.

1. Google Wallet (for Android users)

 - **App crashing:**
 - Try restarting the app.
 - Ensure your app and operating system are up to date.
